

EXPLORE THE EMMONS COUNTY MUSEUM



In Linton, on the corner of Northwest First Street and Oak Avenue, you will find the EMMONS COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY'S MUSEUM. It is housed in the St. Matthews Episcopal Church which was built in 1902 of sandstone quarried from north of Linton.

The Emmons County Historical Society was chartered by the State of North Dakota as an independent organization in April 1973, their purpose being to institute and maintain a county museum and to preserve and disseminate information relating to local history.

A few of the exhibits in the church building are: the Temvik Post Office, a display of military memorabilia dating back to the Civil War, a replica of the Temvik Methodist Church, two Golden Eagles, one Bald Eagle, a round potbellied stove, an old time store and many more items that tell the story of our heritage.

A second building was erected when the church became crowded. It houses a Linotype from the Emmons County Record, part of a log cabin, and the safe that was stolen from Williamsport so Linton could be the county seat.

Across the alley is the rectory for the church which is part of the museum complex. Among some of the things housed are a vintage dress worn at Abraham Lincoln's Inaugural, dishes, a pump organ, furniture, plus a children's room filled with toys, furniture and clothes.

Behind the house is a detached garage. Some of the items on display there are a restored buggy, tools and a collection of saddles and tack.
